
Donation Thanks

SUMMER TIME RECIPES

A lot of you asked for the recipes for dishes we had at Shirley & Don Bridger's event in Jonesboro, Arkasnas this past summer. Below are Gene Barnett's BBQ Sauce and Shirley Bridger's Baked Beans. Remember, the BBQ Sauce is for a large quantity.

BAKED BEANS

1 Can Garbanzo Beans 1 Can Northern Beans
1 Can Kidney Beans 1 Can Pinto Beans
Grated Mozzerella Cheese
Grated Pepper Cheese
Grated Monterey Jack Cheese
2 Diced Onions 2 Diced Bell Peppers
1 LB. Bacon, Browned Ham and/or Peperoni

Season with lots of garlic, salt & pepper, worchester and molassas (lots molassas). Layer beans, seasonings and cheeses. Bake for 1-2 hours at 350 degrees.

BBQ SAUCE

1 Qt. Apple Cider Vinegar
1/2 Small Can Red Ground Pepper
1 TBL Oil or Shortening
1/4 Box Salt
Black Pepper - Add till maroon color

Cook slowly, and keep heated while using.
